# **MIXTO Co2 LASER POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS**

## Before

• There are several good studies that show prepping the skin pre MIXTO Laser resurfacing will lead to a faster healing and a better result. This will involve a Retin-A product, glycolic acid pads, and Hydroquinone depending on your skin type. These products can be purchased through my office.

• 1-2 weeks before call Anesthesia Services- Sarah Smith- (804) 920-2202, if you are having intravenous sedation.

- Fill prescriptions- allow lead time of 1-2 weeks.
- Buy Large Tube Aquaphor Ointment
- Buy Dial Soap
- Buy Cortisone Cream 0.5% over the counter
- · Buy Cetaphil gentle skin Cleanser for sensitive skin
- Buy Cetaphil Body Dry Sensitive Skin Moisturizing cream (in a tub)
- Buy White Vinegar (small bottle)

• You may feel more comfortable with a firm pillow so you can rest your head and not have your face touch anything or a neck pillow so you can sleep on your back. There are a variety of cervical pillows and foam pillows to choose from on Amazon.

• Concealer/ foundation- try to find a "green concealer" it hides the pink discoloration best. Clinique makes a good concealer. Dermablend is also a good concealer. **Do not use a concealer until you are cleared by Dr. Blanchet to use it! Buy the concealer before the procedure!** 

## 3 days before surgery

Shower daily with Dial soap (or anti-bacterial soap)

## Day Before Surgery

- Take 1 tablet Acyclovir at night
- Prepare Vinegar soak- 1tsp white Vinegar to 1 cup cool tap water. Keep in the refrigerator for later
- Do not eat or drink after midnight if you are getting IV sedation

## **Day of Surgery**

- Take 1 Emend or Zofran and 1 Acyclovir, 1 Celebrex with water before surgery
- Use Dial scrub face at home

• 1 hour before your appointment time apply heavy layer of numbing cream- reapply every 30 minutes

- Office will call to let you know when to come in
- Wear loose clothes- a top that buttons in the front

### Medicine to take Post Surgery & on Surgery Day

1 Acyclovir, 1 Celebrex -1- Duricef AM and PM

As needed Percocet- follow label

#### Day 1 after surgery

### Day 2 after Surgery

Acyclovir twice a day

#### **Day 3 after Surgery**

Acyclovir twice a day

Duricef twice a day

#### Day 4 after Surgery

Acyclovir twice a day

Duricef twice a day

#### Post-Surgery- Care of your face

•Wash area eight times a day (every 4 hours) for **two days** including the nighttime. Wash with Cetaphil Cleanse- treat with vinegar soaks.

• To Soak- Soak a thin washcloth or piece of cheese cloth or gauze in the prepared vinegar soak then lightly ring it & place on your face- sit for 15-30 minutes.

• Put a heavy application of Aquaphor Ointment all over the lasered area.

#### Repeat for 2 days-

• Day 5 **Switch to** using Cetaphil moisturizing cream instead of the Aquaphor ointment after washing your face.

**Do not** try to rub off tiny crusts as this can lead facial to scarring. Continue this procedure for washing etc.

## Day 3-5 – Dealing with the itch!

- Use Zyrtec during the day- Benadryl at night.
- Use the 0.5 cortisone cream if necessary- it helps the itching but may slow down the healing.

### Day 5-8 grid will fall off

• Dr. Blanchet will see you frequently as you heal to check on you and answer questions, so plan to stay in town for a week to 10 days if possible. Please email me with questions and a photo if you have any concerns after your procedure

• Do not go out into the sun while you have any residual crusting or redness on your face. If you must be outdoor for the first few weeks wear a large brim hat and use a New tube of broad-spectrum sunblock with UVA and UVB block of at least a SPF 40 and re-apply every 4 hours.

• After one month or when the skin is it's usual color, you may resume retina A, Vitamin C or glycolic acids- please clear this with Dr. Blanchet first.
